Promise Six: The Promise of Victory!

Knowing that all was now completed, and so that the Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I'm thirsty." After Jesus was given a drink, He said, "It is finished!" And with that, He bowed His head and gave up His spirit. (John 19:28-30)

The Three Uses of "Tetelestai"

- Servant: The task is completed!
- Judge: Justice has been served!
- Accountant: The debt has been paid in full!

What Did Jesus "Finish" on the Cross?

1. He finished _____

"I must finish the work that God gave me to do." (John 4:34)

"Everything must be fulfilled that is written about Me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms." Then He opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. He told them, "This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in His Name to all nations." (Luke 24:45-47)

2. He finished _____

"Saving us was all His idea, and all His work. All we do is trust Him enough to let Him do it. It's God's gift from start to finish!" (Ephesians 2:8)

"Anyone who calls upon the name of the Lord will be saved." (Romans 10:13)

3. He finished _____

“God’s Son paid the price to free us, which means our sins are forgiven.” (Colossians 1:14)

“We owed a debt, because we’ve broken God’s laws. That debt listed all the rules we’ve failed to follow. But God forgave our debt, and He cancelled our debt by nailing it to the cross.” (Colossians 2:14)

“After Jesus finished His work, He became the source of eternal salvation for everyone who obeys Him.” (Hebrews 5:9)
