If I find myself angry for weeks, and I'm feeling justified in my anger, maybe the problem isn't <u>out there</u>. Maybe it's <u>in here</u>. Maybe I might want to ask God for some healing in my own heart and let His Holy Spirit do some work in me.

4. He flipped ______, He didn't flip ______.

He transformed it from a "table-flipping moment" to a "peopleloving moment."
